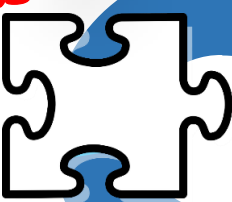

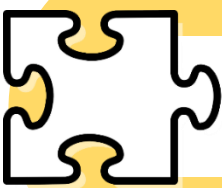
Eg: Functional Mathematics: Build a Farm Think about perimeter and area in context. A project getting students to think about using constraints from written information to create a farm yard space. The farm also brings in the ideas of money calculation, areas and perimeters.

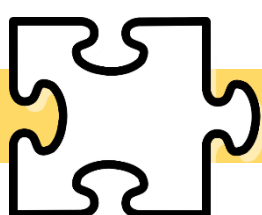
Studies have shown that most children have an affinity for and interest in animals, meaning that lessons with animal content are more likely to capture pupils' attention, making learning more interesting for children
