### **Kingsmead School Provider Access Policy Statement**

Please note that this policy statement is part of the wider careers programme and plan for our School.

#### Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at Kingsmead for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

#### Student entitlement

Under the Baker Clause, all pupils in Year 8 to 13 are entitled to (although we also include Year 7):

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of the careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
