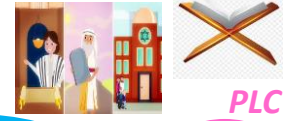

You will have about one month of revision in lessons before your exam to ensure you feel confident going into your A-Level exams.

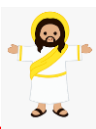


Three two hour exams:

By Christmas you will have learned your two full exam papers on philosophy and ethics..

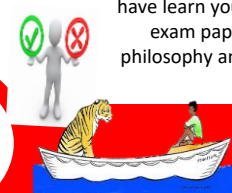

What kinds of topics are in year one ethics?:
In year one ethics you will look at natural moral law, Kantian ethics, utilitarianism, situation ethics, euthanasia and business ethics,

Ethics:
One of the best things about ethics is that you get to discuss and debate how you would use the ethical theory in different situations.



DCT:
In year one of DCT you will study how Christian ideas have changed over the years and how they shape our society today..

What topics will I study?:
You will learn about Augustine & the fall, death & the afterlife, Christian moral action & principles, knowledge of God's existence, Jesus and secularism.



Religion & Ethics:
You will explore different ethical theories that can be used when making a moral decision., As well as having moral issues that you will need to apply them to.

Skills:
During these topics you will develop your evaluative and analytical skills, as well as using these in debate. You will also learn how to write a philosophical essay.



Philosophy of religion:
You will explore ancient philosophical arguments starting with Plato and ending with modern philosopher like Popper and Dawkins,

Philosophy Mock:
Your first mock will be based on the Philosophy topics only. You will have three essays to write in two hours. Timing will be crucial.

A01 & A02:
Throughout this A-Level you will need to develop your A01 (knowledge) skills and A02 (analysis) skills in your essays. 40% of your essays need to be A01 and 60% needs to be analysis.



What kinds of topics are in year one?:
In year one philosophy you will look at ancient philosophy, origins of the universe, the problem of evil, the concept of the soul and religious experience.
