

First Day

Your first day is Wednesday 4th September. You will be welcomed to Kingsmead by Mr. Dyke and Mrs. Taylor, followed by an assembly setting out our high expectations of all our students. There will also be an explanation of the exciting activities you will be doing in the first few days as part of your Year 7 induction.

What time do I arrive on the first day?

For your first day, we will meet you on Rocky Park, Wood Lane at 8:30am. Mr. Dyke and Mrs. Taylor will be there to greet you.

Entry to school site

Students can enter the school from 8:15am onwards at either Rocky Park or the gate at Littleworth Road.

What time should I arrive to school on a normal day?

You should arrive by 8:20am to allow time to get to your first lesson, which begins promptly at 8:30am. If you arrive late, you must sign in with Attendance at the Progress Hub.

What happens if I am late to lessons?


In the first couple of weeks it is not unusual for you to get lost and arrive a little late to lessons. Teachers will expect this. However, after two weeks you will be surprised at how well you know your way around. After this initial period, if you are late to period 1 you will need to go to Attendance where you will be given a late slip. If you are late to any other period during the day, you will receive a late mark.

What lessons will I have?

You will have a paper copy of your timetable. You can also view your timetable online. The night before, check what lessons you have and pack everything ready for the next day.

How do I keep my possessions safe?

Support

Student Support - The Progress Hub

The Progress Hub is located in the middle of B block, next to B06. Progress Leaders and Assistant Progress Leaders are a specialised team who are available at all times and are happy to help with any concerns, in or out of school. The Progress Leader for Year 7 is Mrs. Taylor.

Students can come to the hub if:

- They need help with something, whether its related to school or not
- They are worried about something or someone
- They need to contact home
- They have an academic or wellbieng mentor session
- They need to borrow an item of uniform
- They have a barrier to their learning they need supprot with

What will I need for PE?

You will not need your PE kit for your first lesson. You will be asked to write in the back of your planner which sports you will be doing during which dates. You can then pack appropriate kit.

Indoor: Black and Gold Kingsmead polo shirt, black Kingsmead shorts, Kingsmead football / hockey socks or black / white ankle socks, trainers.

Outdoor: Black and gold Kingsmead polo shirt, black Kingsmead shorts, football boots / trainers.

In addition students may wear: Kingsmead multi sports top, Kingsmead sweatshirt, plain black tracksuit with white stripes. (Gum shields and shin pads must be worn for football and hockey)

Reception

Lessons

What do I do at the start of a lesson?

When you enter your classroom, you should sit where your teacher asks you to and prepare your books and equipment for the lesson. There will be an engaging starter activity for you to complete as you sit down ready to learn! You should also have any homework ready to hand when needed.

Who will my teachers be?

Unlike primary school, you will have different teachers for each subject you study. Each lesson will also be in a different classroom. This can be confusing at the start but don't worry, you will soon find your way around. Ask our Kingsmead staff or students who will be more than happy to point you in the right direction. A map will also be given to you.

What will my teachers expect from me?

All the teachers will have high expectations of you and will expect you to work hard and to be the best you can be. This includes completing all your work to your best ability and listening carefully at all times. Put yourself out there and believe in yourself! Demonstrate a positive attitude towards learning. Be respectful - all students are expected to stand when a member of staff enters the classroom. Presentation of your work needs to be of the highest standard at all times.





Home Learning

Satchel:One

You will receive regular home learning throughout Year 7, from a whole range of subjects. Some of these will be larger, extended writing assignments whilst some may be project based. All home learning will be assigned via the 'Satchel:One' website. You will be able to see all the home learning you have been given by your teachers, including the deadline the homeowork is due in, instructions and guidelines on how to complete the work and any resources you may need. You will receive log in details for your Satchel:One account in September. Parents will also have access to your Satchel:One account.

Home learning will help you:

- Be a better learner
- Develop your study skills
- 'Lock in' all the learning you have achieved during school.

Sometimes home learning will:

- Extend work started in lessons
- Provide an opportunity to prepare work for your next lesson
- Give you preparation time for a upcoming test
- Close the gaps (intervention)

Top tips for successful home learning completion:

- Listen to homework instructions in class
- Read correctly the assignment on Satchel:One and download any resources uploaded to help you
- Ensure homework is completed and handed in on time
- Attempt all homework and always try your best
- Inform you subject teacher of any difficulties you have

How much home learning will I get?

Home learning may take the form of an individual piece of work or indeed an extended project. You should not be spending more than one hour a night on home learning.

Feedback

Work is regulary marked by your teachers. Marking is done in a variety of ways, including:

- **Self marking** Where you mark your own work against specific criteria given by your teacher.
- **Peer marking** Marking each other's work.
- Verbal feedback Your teacher discusses the positive things about your work and the areas to improve on.
- Marking with a particular focus e.g. spelling, punctuation,
 presentation etc. We expect you to
 take action on any feedback you
 receive.





Rewards - XP

What is XP?

XP stands for 'experience points'. This is just like gaming where you can level up and unlock special rewards based on how many XP you earn. XP are counted throughout the year and area awarded when you show one or more of the Kingsmead School values: Resilience, Innovcation, Mindfulness and Employability.

How is XP awarded?


You can earn XP in lessons and around the school. They can be awarded by any member of staff or even visitors. If you have earned XP, then you will be told by the member of staff who will log your XP on MCAS. You and your parents / guardians will be able to see this immediately by using your own MCAS login, which means you can keep checking your XP throughout the whole year.

What is XP awarded for?

XP is awarded to students who go above and beyond our high expectations. They are given to students who display one or more of our RIME values and there is no limit to how many you can earn.

What do I get for XP?

The number of XP you earn can give you access to weekly, fortnightly and monthly rewards as well as termly events, reward trips and even VIP treatment and first choice for activities in the summer term. Some rewards you can earn are Amazon vouchers, skip the dinner queue, free meal deals and much more!



Enrichment

We have always offered an extensive range of extra curricular activities at Kingsmead. We offer two enrichement activities a week that all students undertake as part of their school day. For one hour on a Tuesday and a Wednesday afternoon, all students will opt into a fantastic, engaging activity that will nurture and unlock talents, develop character and create enriching, memorable experiences.
